Filing a Sexual Misconduct Complaint (Title IX)

Title IX requires Paul Quinn College to respond to harassment on the basis of sex, which includes sexual harassment, sexual violence, domestic violence, and stalking.

The College must:

- Investigate what happened,
- Take appropriate steps to resolve the matter,
- Do its best to eliminate the harassment and prevent recurrence,
- Remedy effects, even if no formal complaint has been made,
- Take interim measures during the investigation to prevent potential further harassment.

About Title IX:

Title IX of the Education Amendments of 1972, 20 U.S.C §1681, prohibits discrimination based on gender in all programs or activities that receive Federal financial assistance. Title IX also includes sexual harassment, same gender harassment as well as student to student harassment.

Title IX forbids sex discrimination in all college student services and academic programs including, but not limited to, admissions, financial aid, academic advising, housing, athletics, recreational services, college residential life programs, health services, counseling and psychological services, Registrar's office, classroom assignments, grading and discipline. Title IX also forbids discrimination because of sex in employment and recruitment consideration or selection, whether full time or part time, under any education program or activity operated by an institution receiving or benefiting from federal financial assistance ("recipient").
